

Mail-Order Suppliers

IMPORTANT: Mail-order suppliers may leave the network without notifying participants. To avoid non-network benefits (which include a deductible and can cost you more), ask the mail-order supplier if they still participate in the Blue Choice (HealthSelect) network before you order supplies.

Below are several* contracting Durable Medical Equipment (DME) Suppliers with Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Texas (BCBSTX). These companies can mail items such as diabetic supplies, ostomy supplies, respiratory supplies, etc., directly to you.

Not all companies listed below carry all DME and supplies, so call the company to find out if they carry the item you need.

The company you order from will set up an account for you. Have your HealthSelect medical ID card handy, which includes your group number (38000 or 38001) and subscriber ID number. The company will usually verify your coverage with BCBSTX and contact your physician.

As a HealthSelect participant, you can buy supplies from any DME provider, such as your local pharmacy. However, if the provider is not ParPlan or not in the BlueChoice (HealthSelect) network, you will have to pay up front and file a claim for reimbursement. You will also be responsible for paying the difference between the billed and the allowable amount.
