## COVID-19 COMMUNITY COLLABORATION FUND

BCBSTX contributed \$1 million each to the Communities Foundation of Texas and the Texas Restaurant Association Education Foundation's Restaurant Relief Fund. As a result of this support, TRAEF was able to provide 257 independent restaurants across the state with \$2,500 grants, allowing them to remain open and operating. These businesses provided, on average, 150 meals each to local first responder locations (hospitals, senior care, police, and fire). In addition, more than 48,000 frontline workers received free meals from partner restaurants as an expression of thanks across all 254 counties in Texas.

#### NATURAL DISASTER GIVING

Two hurricanes made landfall in Texas in 2020, affecting the lives of hundreds of thousands of residents. In response, BCBSTX donated \$150,000 to the American Red Cross, the Salvation Army and the Southwest Texas Foodbank to help the nearly 500,000 residents displaced by Hurricane Laura. And when Hurricane Hanna hit, BCBSTX gave \$100,000 to food banks in the affected areas.
