



Negotiation with Medical Center Hospital

Blue Cross and Blue Shield of Texas (BCBSTX) is negotiating new contracts with **Medical Center Hospital (MCH)** in Odessa. This affects many BCBSTX plans, not just TRS's. Here's what you need to know:

WHAT THIS MEANS

If BCBSTX doesn't sign **new contracts before June 1, 2023, MCH won't be in network for any BCBSTX health plans**, including your TRS-ActiveCare plan, on that date.

WHY WE'RE REACHING OUT

This may impact you if MCH goes out of network. **BCBSTX can help make your move to other facilities as seamless as possible** if you need new care options on or after June 1:

- You can always access in-network hospitals in BCBSTX's robust network.
- BCBSTX will work with you on a continuity of care plan, if eligible.
- BCBSTX can help you schedule procedures at other in-network facilities.

EMERGENCIES ARE STILL COVERED

If MCH is the only option in the area where you have an emergency, rest assured you can still use it. **TRS-ActiveCare always covers emergency services at the in-network level**, no matter which facility you use.
